This generous act further strengthens and maintains the ties we have with our Indigenous partners and community members.

As a non-profit society in Alberta whose mission and guiding principles are to promote multiculturalism and create a platform for the diverse communities that live in Calgary, we offer our stages, our festival, and our voices, to shine a spotlight on this beautiful place.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Our programming began with a new initiative: Holiday Lane, at Sunridge Mall. Ten of our cultural partner community associations decorated Christmas trees on display in the mall for the month of December. In May, we celebrated Asian Heritage Month with a massive two-week outreach program at Southcentre Mall, featuring our China, India and Philippines communities. We had two Sundays packed with hands-on activities and performances that filled the mall with the sights and sounds of Asia.





In June, with our new partners Development Group at their new N.E. show home parade, we produced a mini OneWorld Festival including a performance stage, food trucks and other activities. It was a perfect weather day for this community festival. Special thanks for our partner home builders in the community, Trico Homes and Excel Homes.







Summer went into full swing with OneWorld cultural presentations at Heritage Park on Canada Day and the Calgary Stampede. On the new BMO Centre Community Stage, we had 11 days of performances and cultural pavilion spaces, and the performances were well attended throughout the run. There were 26 different cultural performance groups and 5 cultural association promotional spaces. GlobalFest would like to express our sincere appreciation to the Calgary Stampede for continuing to engage and providing these opportunities to our OneWorld cultural community association partners and to our festival.

Our summer continued in August with the Dragonboat Festival with a broad range of performance groups participating in the two-day race event in North Glenmore Park. Sponsored by Trico Livingwell who continues to partner with us in various programming opportunities for their residents.

INTERNSHIPS AND MENTORSHIPS

The Youth Leaders of Tomorrow Program is an annual program GlobalFest undertakes to bring in a variety of post-secondary students and young adults to gain experience in the festival/non-profit sector. The YLOT program had a returnee from last year with Anna Pham coming back for a second year with an expanded program of responsibility. (See Page 8)

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

MySummerJourney YCC returned for another year at Sunalta Community Association Hall. We continue to work with our referral agencies Calgary Immigrant Women's Association, Centre for Newcomers, and Immigrant Services Calgary who referred the youth to our program. Our two-week program engaged immigrant/refugee youth, ages 11 – 16, with just under 20 youth participating in the program. (See Page 25)




□□ CITIZENSHIP CEREMON≯

MySummerJourneyYYC 2025 brought together teens from China, Colombia, and Ukraine for two enriching weeks this July. Throughout the program, participants formed new friendships, shared their cultures and values, built independence, improved literacy skills, and had fun through a variety of immersive activities and excursions.







A major highlight was the drum circle, where teens expressed emotions through rhythm and percussion. Cultural learning continued with a trip to Blackfoot Crossing Historical Park, where storytelling and exploring the Tipi Village provided insight into Blackfoot culture and the significance of Treaty 7.

At Bar U Ranch, a Canadian National Historic Site, teens experienced life as early Alberta homesteaders. A visit to the architecturally inspiring Calgary Central Library highlighted the importance of lifelong reading, especially with its teen-dedicated floor.

The Calgary Contemporary Art Gallery offered a space to explore emotions and cultural storytelling through visual art. Teens also learned environmental responsibility during a Green Calgary presentation on recycling and composting.

Servus Credit Union taught essential financial literacy, while a visit to the Beltline Fire Department equipped them with knowledge on fire safety and emergency preparedness. Walking tours through Chinatown, local parks, and green spaces deepened their understanding of Calgary's urban environment.

Creative expression continued at The Alcove Centre for the Arts, where teens engaged in art, musical jam sessions, and board games. The Alcove also presented opportunities for future artistic involvement.

Physical activity and play were emphasized through Hip Hop dance lessons with Connie Jakab, as well as cooperative games that highlighted teamwork and healthy living.

Throughout these two weeks, the teens reflected through writing, explored their identities, and connected deeply with each other. The program encouraged personal growth, cultural appreciation, and community building-all while enjoying the fun and challenges of being a teenager. My Summer Journey YYC 2025 successfully blended education, creativity, and joy, leaving lasting memories and meaningful connections among its diverse group of participants.

The Alberta Thai-Canadian Association (Calgary), (ATCA), was formed in 2002 to promote friendship and good understanding between Thai's and Canadians, to maintain and promote the cultural heritage of Thailand and to provide opportunities for social activities for its' members.

Thailand is a predominantly Buddhist Kingdom in Southeast Asia. It has an area about the same as Alberta but a population of 70 million. Thailand shares borders with Myanmar to the west and north, Laos to the north-east, Kampuchea to the east, and Malaysia to the south. Thailand lies within the humid tropics and remains hot throughout the year. Average temperatures are about 29 °C. There are three seasons: the cool season (November to March), the hot season (April to May), and the rainy season (June to October).

Thailand is filled with spectacular natural, cultural, and historical attractions and has a rich cultural heritage and

diverse landscapes of great natural beauty featuring Buddhist temples, exotic wildlife, and spectacular islands and beaches. Along with a fascinating history and a unique culture that includes delectable Thai food and massage, Thailand features a modern capital city Bangkok, and friendly people who epitomize Thailand's "land of smiles" reputation.

Dance is the main dramatic art form in Thailand and can be divided into two major categories, high art (classical dance) and low art (folk dance). The ATCA sponsors its' own Thai Dance group comprised of members volunteering their time to learn and perform classical and folk dances. The beautiful girls dance barefoot with great smiles, graceful and delicate movements in their elaborate costumes. The dances are hypnotic and follow lovely rhythms made from oriental musical instruments. It is the designer's hope that the audience will lose themselves in the colours and rhythms of the display, while simultaneously being mesmerized by the cadence of the explosions and glittering forms.

GlobalFest wishes to acknowledge the passing of a dear friend and member of the GlobalFest family, Raymond Charles Lee (Judge Ray). To Loretta and the entire extended Lee family, our heartfelt condolences.

Ray approached GlobalFest in 2011 with a special request. At that time, he was serving as a Citizenship Court Judge for the Government of Canada, overseeing citizenship applications within the province of Alberta. He had heard about GlobalFest's Human Rights, and the work we were doing in this area. He had a strong desire to expand the impact of citizenship, not only for the new Canadians becoming Canadian citizens, but also for Canadians in general. His goal, to get the citizenship ceremonies into the public realm and outside of the office confines of the Harry Hays Building.

GlobalFest held its first Citizenship Ceremony at the former John Dutton Theatre in the old Calgary Public Library Main Branch, on Tuesday, July 16, 2011 as part of our Human Rights Forum. Since then we have hosted 15 citizenship ceremonies, eventually moving the ceremonies to Elliston Park. Over 1,250 individuals have taken their first steps as Canadian Citizens at a GlobalFest event, a tradition we are so proud of.

GlobalFest nominated Ray for the tremendous work he did in community throughout his life for the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal in 2022 and were honoured to present him with that award.

Ray, his wife Loretta and their family became an integral part of the GlobalFest family over the years.

To honour Ray for the tremendous gift, meaning and purpose he gave to GlobalFest, we are dedicating the Tuesday, August 19 fireworks presentation (Philippines Night) in his memory.

"Ray, you will always and forever be a star in our eyes! May you rest in peace knowing of our dedication to keep the good works you started continue into the future."
